Pamela P. Lackey served as president of AT&T South from 2007 through July 2018. In that role, she was responsible for public policy, economic development and community affairs, working closely with state and community leaders to help bring new technology and jobs to the state and improve the quality of life for all South Carolinians. A professional educator prior to her telecommunications career, she was recognized as one of the state's most influential business voices on the need for quality education for all children.

Now retired from AT&T, Ms. Lackey continues to be extensively engaged in community and civic affairs through leadership roles with numerous local and state organizations. She is currently co-chair of the Transform SC education initiative, a past chair of the SC State Chamber of Commerce, and past chair of the SC Ports Authority Board, having been appointed by former Governor Haley and originally confirmed by the State Senate in 2011.

In addition, she serves on the boards of the Business Partnership Foundation at USC's Moore School of Business, the United Way of the Midlands, the Hollings Cancer Center Advisory Board, and the International African American Museum Board. She is the first female chair of the Palmetto Business Forum and the South Carolina Ports Authority.
